# **Opening and Registration**

# **Entry to Mexico City**

#### Visas

The participants are responsible for obtaining their own entry and/or transit visa(s) to Mexico, if required. All participants should travel with their passport with a valid date of at least 6 months, counting from the entry date into the country.

Foreigners will not require a Mexican visa if they provide one of the following documents:

- Document that confirms the permanent residence in Canada, United States of America, Japan, Great Britain and North Ireland, or any of the countries that are part of the Schengen area.
- Valid United States of America visa.
- APEC (ABTC) Business Traveller Card authorized by Mexico.

## **Transfers from the airport**

The Hotel Royal Pedregal, Mexico DF, is located40 km from the international airport. The most convenient means of transportation is by cab, with an estimated time between 40 and 75 minutes depending on traffic conditions. The authorized cabs are available directly outside the luggage claim area. It is recommended to use only authorized cabs at the Airport Terminal, which are: Porto Taxi, Site 300, Nueva Imagen and Excelencia at Terminal 1; and Porto Taxi, Site 300, Nueva Imagen, Excelencia, Confort or Yellow Cab at Terminal 2. ### **Accommodation and DSA**

The participants of the *Intersessional Meeting of the Forum of Ministers of Environment of Latin America and the Caribbean* that are financed by UNEP will be staying at the **Hotel Royal Pedregal – Mexico DF**

#### DSA

The participants that are entitled to financial assistance will receive their DSA during the meeting. Each participant should provide copy of their passport and original boarding passes used from their country of origin until their arrival in Mexico City.

# **General information**

#### Currency

The official currency in Mexico is the Mexican Peso (MXN). Some businesses, restaurants and service stations or gas stations accept United States dollars (US\$) at the daily exchange rate. Currency changes fluctuate, but currently USD \$ 1,00 (dollar) = 16.53 MXN (Mexican

pesos). Cash can be exchanged at the international airport counters. Most businesses accept credit cards such as American Express, Master Card and Visa.

#### Information on climate and time zone

Mexico City has a humid subtropical climate, warm in the summer and dry during the winter, cool and rainy summers and moderate seasonal variations. In November, the average temperature in Mexico City is 13.5° C, and ranges from 6 °C to 21 °C. There is very little rain in November (average precipitation of 16mm).

The standard time zone in Mexico is -6 GMT or UTC.

# Electricity

The electric current in Mexico are 110-120 volts and 60 Hertz. The electrical outlets that are used are of A/B type (image following).

The international dialing code for Mexico is: 52 The area code for Mexico City is 55.

## **Security information**

It is recommended to take preventive measures to avoid thefts due to the lack of caution and to preferably use the authorized hotel cabs or radio taxis.
